For your pet to stay with us for surgery, he or she **MUST** be 6 months or older and be up to date on the following:

Canine: Heartworm/4dx/Lyme test must be done if pet is 6 months or older- your cost will be \$62

Canine Distemper Vaccine your cost will be \$35

Rabies Vaccine- your cost will be \$35

Feline: Feline Leukemia/AIDS test your cost will be \$50

Feline Distemper your cost will be \$35

Rabies Vaccine your cost will be \$35

What's included with IIth Hour surgery?

- **Spay/Neuter surgery**
- **Pain Management**
Pain management becomes particularly important after surgeries. When recovering from invasive procedures, animals may not only be in pain, but they may also be weak and disoriented. The doctor will give your pet a pain injection after surgery and may also administer medication before, during and/or after the procedure to reduce pain and discomfort.
- **Antibiotic Injection**
An antibiotic injection will be administered so that your pet will not come down with an infection. Administering an antibiotic injection followed by oral antibiotics will greatly reduce the chances of infection.

Not included

- **Meds to go home (\$60)**
Your pet will be sent home with an antibiotic and pain medication for several days. This is required. Cost for take home medicines are the pet owners' responsibility.
- **Elizabethan Collar (\$15)**
The doctor requires the use of an Elizabethan collar for at least 10 days after the surgery to ensure proper healing of the surgical site. If you wish to decline for any reason, please be aware that you will be held responsible for any additional charges if your pet removes the sutures. _____

Not included but recommended and optional

- **Pre- Anesthetic Blood Testing (RECCOMENDED)**
Pre-Anesthetic blood work maximizes patient safety by alerting us to the presence of anemia, infection, diabetes, kidney disease, liver disease, and/or dehydration. With this knowledge, we may elect to forgo the anesthetic/surgical procedure, modify the anesthetic regimen, or change your pet's medication. While performing blood work cannot guarantee that your pet will not have any problems with the anesthesia or surgical procedure, it can significantly minimize the risk to your pet and give us both peace of mind. Pre-anesthetic blood testing is highly recommended for pets 7 years or older.

- a. **Profile #1: Healthy pets under 7 years of age. [\$60]**

Includes: BUN (kidney), ALKP (liver), Glucose (sugar), Total Protein (hydration/inflammation), ALT (liver), Creatinine (kidney), CBC (complete blood count, e.g., infection, anemia, clotting)

- b. **Profile #2:** Pets 7 years or older (highly recommended) or sick patients [**\$120**]
Includes: Everything in profile #1, and Albumin (protein), Phosphorous (kidney), Calcium (tumors), Total Bilirubin (liver), Amylase (pancreas), Cholesterol

• **I.V. Catheter [\$50] (RECCOMENDED)**

An I.V. catheter allows for easy access to a vein in case a problem is encountered during surgery. It also helps to keep and maintain your pet's blood pressure at a normal rate during surgery.

An I.V. catheter will be placed before your pet is put under anesthesia, and fluids will be administered before, during, and after surgery.
